


JESUS CHRIST and the Characteristics of the NT Church

(Based on first five chapters of the Book of Acts)



I believe the first five chapters of Book of Acts provide a comprehensive description of the characteristics of the NT Church. The NT Church is composed of **NT Disciples**, individuals who have **REPENTED**, accepted **JESUS CHRIST** by faith, and have been BAPTIZED! The diagram below allows you to walk through the first five chapters and examine the focus and characteristics of the NT Church.

JESUS CHRIST and the Characteristics of the New Testament (NT) Church

(Based on the 1st five chapters in the Book of Acts) October 1, 2022 (Version 3)

This **diagram aims** to provide individuals with a picture of the NT Church based on the *Book of Acts*. In addition, this Scriptural outline of the first five chapters provides a lens into Acts that may escape the casual readers. The <u>top of the diagram</u> shows how prominently and frequently the **Name of JESUS CHRIST** appears in just these first five chapters, which record the history of the beginning of the NT Church. The diagram depicts how all teaching and preaching were done strictly in the **Name of JESUS CHRIST**. You also learn about the healing done through the **Name of JESUS CHRIST**. Notes to help with reading the timeline:

- 1. Numbers on the Timeline: mark the chapter divisions. Chapter 1 begins on the left. Chapter 5 is at the end of the timeline
- 2. Shorter lines extending above and below the timeline: The first scripture reference is above the timeline. The second scripture reference is below the timeline. The remaining scriptures continually alternate from above to below the timeline
- 3. Red lettering, capitalization, and bolding: The names of JESUS CHRIST and the HOLY GHOST are fully capitalized, bold, and colored red to draw attention to how much the Name of JESUS CHRIST is used and how essential the HOLY GHOST is to being a disciple of JESUS CHRIST.

The **bottom of the diagram** shows the Characteristics of the NT Church based primarily on the description provided in Acts 2:42-47. It also includes other characteristics found in the Scriptural Patterns of the NT Church seen throughout the first five chapters of Acts. Characteristics include: (1) **Preached in JESUS' name**, (2) Filled with the HOLY GHOST, (3) Disciples feared GOD, (4) Healed in JESUS' name, (5) met in houses, (6) followed the Apostles' doctrines, (7) fellowship, (8) breaking of bread, (9) continuing in prayers, (10) bodies are the temple of the HOLY GHOST, (11) gave to meet disciple's needs, (12) disciples sold possessions to obtain funds to give, (13) disciples had all things common, (14) disciples continued on one accord, (15) preached repentance and baptism, and (16) taught of JESUS in the temple.

SUMMARY: It became striking how <u>many times</u> the names of JESUS CHRIST and the HOLY GHOST were mentioned in the Book of Acts' first five chapters. To bring home what I saw in my imagination, I created this chart to help individuals visualize the pattern I saw. This chart captures what materialized in my imagination. Then I wondered when, where, how, and why did the Organized Church <u>STOP</u> preaching and teaching about JESUS CHRIST and the POWER in His name? When did the Organized Church <u>STOP</u> emphasizing that NT Disciples <u>MUST be BORN AGAIN</u> and <u>FILLED</u> with the HOLY GHOST?

JESUS and the **HOLY GHOST** seem to be **rarely mentioned in the Organized Church's pulpits and teachings**.

I challenge you to read and study the Holy Scriptures and decide for yourself! The early NT Church did NOT know how to move or operate without the HOLY GHOST! Many were diligent in reading all the writings of the Apostles.

I challenge you to rediscover the Holy Scriptures and to seek to be led by the HOLY GHOST!
