 - Encourage the Growth of individuals who have professed a hope in JESUS CHRIST!
 - Teaching individuals "HOW-TO" read and study the NT Holy Scriptures of the New Covenant in JESUS' blood so they can experience transformation and be prepared for the LORD's soon return!



Foundation Reset (Expectation Set)



This is not about debating the merits of the Organized Christian Church

• I personally do not have an opinion for or against Organized Churches

- They can be great and powerful in the Kingdom of GOD, If they make disciples and teach the NT Holy Scriptures in their entirety and in agreement with the Holy Spirit
- However, they can be deceiving, seducing, and destructive to those they are leading if they
 replace the Holy Scriptures with their own philosophical, political, economic, social, or other
 doctrines

This is about awakening individuals to the NT Scriptural Commandments for them to become Disciples (G3101, 3101. mathetes, math-ay-tes'; from G3129; a learner, i.e. pupil:--disciple)

- JESUS says that those who will follow Him must "deny" themselves, take up their "cross" and "follow" Him (St. Matt. 16:24-26)
- Peter commanded newborn babes to desire (love, seek) the sincere milk of GOD's Word so they can grow (1 Pet. 2:1-2)



Focused on Your Growth



The <u>teachings provided in this conference</u> are to <u>teach</u> and <u>equip you</u> to <u>read</u>, <u>study</u>, and <u>meditate</u> on the Scriptures of the NT Covenant established in JESUS' blood that ye might be <u>washed</u> and <u>cleansed</u> by the WORD of GOD! Also, "How-To" be <u>led</u> by the Holy Spirit!

Those who profess JESUS CHRIST were <u>commanded</u> to be <u>transformed</u> by the <u>renewing</u> of their mind through the WORDs that JESUS CHRIST sent through the Holy Apostles Whom he had chosen. (Acts 1:1-2)

- 1. The former treatise have I made, O Theophilus, of all that Jesus began both <u>to do</u> and <u>teach</u>,
- 2. Until the day in which he <u>was taken up</u>, after that he through the Holy Ghost <u>had given commandments</u> unto <u>the apostles</u> whom he <u>had chosen</u>:







- 1. <u>Help those who profess</u> to know and follow JESUS CHRIST to begin to <u>earnestly read</u>, <u>study</u>, and <u>search</u> the Holy Scriptures, that they may begin to grow as the LORD's Disciples (St. John 5:39; Acts 11:17)
- 2. Encourage Disciples to "desire the sincere milk of God's Word so they might grow! (1 Peter 2:2)
- **3.** <u>Help</u> Disciples to read and study the Scriptures through a new lens (2 Tim. 2:15)
- **4.** Encourage Disciples to <u>do</u> critical thinking (meditation) about all the Words in the "key" Scriptures in the pursuit of following Jesus Christ (2 Pet. 1:19-21)
- 5. <u>Exhort Disciples to obtain knowledge of the coming eternal judgment</u> through reading the Holy Scriptures so they can prepare for Jesus' return as wise Virgins! (St Matt. 25:1-13; Rev. 21:6-8; 22:14-15)





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Greek Definitions to Key Discipleship Words

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- It is critical that Disciples know and use the original definitions of the words that God gave to the Apostle writers of the NT Scriptures
 - The Word of God is eternal and never changes (Psa. 119:89, 160; 1 Pet. 1:25; St. Mat. 24:35; St. Mark 13:31; St. Luke 21:33; 2 Tim. 3:16-17)
 - Scriptures are not open to private interpretations of individuals (2 Pet. 1:20-21)
 - Many translations have perverted the true meanings of the Words given by the Holy Ghost through the Apostles
 - The <u>Greek language</u> was chosen by God for the <u>NT Writings</u>
 - Greek language is one of the most expressive languages in the world next to Hebrew
 - Many religious leaders have <u>exclude key discipleship words from their</u> <u>teachings</u>
 - Having the true definitions from the original language will enable disciples to truly understand and follow God's NT Commandments so they can walk upright and please Him

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- Disciple
 - 3101. <u>mathetes</u>, math-ay-tes'; from G3129; a <u>learner</u>, i.e. <u>pupil</u>:--<u>disciple</u>.
- Repent
 - 3340. <u>metanoeo</u>, met-an-o-eh'-o; from G3326 and G3539; <u>to think</u> <u>differently</u> or afterwards, i.e. <u>reconside</u>r (mor. feel compunction):--<u>repent</u>.
- Sanctify
 - 37. hagiazo, hag-ee-ad'-zo; from G40; to make holy, i.e. (cer.) purify or consecrate; (mentally) to venerate:--hallow, be holy, sanctify.
- Sanctification
 - 38. hagiasmos, hag-ee-as-mos'; from G37; prop. purification, i.e. (the state) purity; concr. (by Hebr.) a purifier:--holiness, sanctification.





• Holiness

- 38. hagiasmos, hag-ee-as-mos'; from G37; prop. purification, i.e. (<u>the state</u>) purity; concr. (by Hebr.) <u>a purifier</u>:--<u>holiness</u>, <u>sanctification</u>.
- Holy & Saint (same word)
 - 40. hagios, hag'-ee-os; from hagos (an awful thing) [comp. G53, H2282]; sacred (phys. pure, mor. blameless or religious, cer. consecrated):--(most) holy (one, thing), saint.

• Perfect

5046. teleios, tel'-i-os; from G5056; <u>complete</u> (in <u>various applications</u> of <u>labor</u>, <u>growth</u>, <u>mental</u> and <u>moral character</u>, etc.); neut. (as noun, with G3588) <u>completeness</u>:--<u>of full age</u>, man, <u>perfect</u>.

- 2513. <u>katharos</u>, kath-ar-os'; of uncert. affin.; <u>clean</u> (lit. or fig.):--<u>clean</u>, <u>clear</u>, <u>pure</u>.

 - 48. hagnizo, hag-nid'-zo; from G53; <u>to make clean</u>, i.e. (fig.) <u>sanctify</u> (cer. or mor.):--purity (self).

 - 458. anomia, an-om-ee'-ah; from G459; illegality, i.e. violation of law or (gen.) wickedness:--iniquity, X transgress (-ion of) the law, unrighteousness.

Definition of Church



"Why two definitions of CHURCH is used in this conference and my book? – because the Ekklesia (the Greek word used in the NT for Church) is Scripturally defined as the Body of JESUS CHRIST and it is good if it follows CHRIST's will! (See page 411 in book, "Paul, The Moses of the New Testament Church")

- 1. NT Church is when men follow the Scriptural Patterns that define the Church as recorded in the Book of Acts and throughout the NT Apostles' writings (27 books). The NT Church consists of all the DISCIPLES who are the living stones, the Bride of JESUS CHRIST, that was birthed by the HOLY GHOST on the Day of Pentecost
- 2. Organized Church (also Institutional, Christian, Religious, etc.) is when men replace the Holy Scriptures and the interpretations given by the Holy Spirit (the Holy Ghost) with their own system of beliefs, traditions, and dogma.



Scriptural Definition of the Heart



- It is critical that a Disciple define the heart based on Scriptures
 - Many individuals think the heart is where they based their decisions on emotional and learned behavior
 - However the Scriptures provide us a true definition of what constitutes the Heart
 - Understanding what the heart will guide individuals to know "How-To" please GOD;
 - Disciples were given the commandment to love the LORD our GOD with all heart
 - It is hard if not impossible to love GOD with all our heart if we lack the clearest scriptural understanding



Scriptural Definition of the Heart



Genesis 6:5-9 provides the best definition of the Heart in the Scriptures

- 5. And God saw that the <u>wickedness</u> of man was great in the earth, and that every <u>imagination</u> of the <u>thoughts</u> of his <u>heart</u> was <u>only</u> <u>evil</u> <u>continually</u>.
- 6. And it repented the LORD that he had made man on the earth, and it grieved him at his heart.
- 7. And the LORD said, I will <u>destroy</u> man whom I have created from the face of the earth; both man, and beast, and the creeping thing, and the fowls of the air; for it repenteth me that I have made them.
- 8. But <u>Noah</u> found grace in the <u>eyes</u> of the LORD.
- 9. These are the generations of <u>Noah</u>: <u>Noah</u> was a just man and <u>perfec</u>t in his generations, and <u>Noah</u> walked with God.

Man's heart in Scriptures = the Sum of the thoughts of his imagination





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Disciples Forbade to Have or Read the Holy Scriptures

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Christianity Forbade Laity to Read



- 1. Decree of the Council of Toulouse (1229 C.E.): "We prohibit also that the laity should be permitted to have the books of the Old or New Testament; but we most strictly forbid their having any translation of these books."
- 2. <u>Ruling of the Council of Tarragona of 1234 C.E</u>: "<u>No one may possess</u> the books of the Old and New Testaments in the <u>Romance language</u>, and if anyone <u>possesses them</u> he must <u>turn them over</u> to the local bishop within eight days after promulgation of this decree, so that <u>they may be burned</u>..."



Christianity Forbade Laity to Read



- 3. <u>Proclamations at the Ecumenical Council of Constance in 1415 C.E.</u>: Oxford professor, and theologian John Wycliffe, was the first (1380 C.E.) to <u>translate</u> the New Testament into English to "...helpeth Christian men to <u>study</u> the Gospel in <u>that tongue in which they know best</u> Christ's sentence." For this "heresy" Wycliffe was <u>posthumously condemned</u> by Arundel, the archbishop of Canterbury. By the Council's decree "<u>Wycliffe's bones were exhumed</u> and <u>publicly burned</u> and the <u>ashes were thrown into the Swift River.</u>"
- 4. Fate of William Tyndale in 1536 C.E.: William Tyndale was <u>burned at the</u> stake for translating the Bible into English. According to Tyndale, the <u>Church</u> forbid owning or reading the Bible to <u>control</u> and <u>restrict</u> the <u>teachings</u> and to enhance their own <u>power</u> and <u>importance</u>.

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

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What Does God Want?

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These seven (7) items provide a roadmap to discipleship

- **1. Repentance** (Think Differently)
- 2. Faith (God requires this first)
- **3. Die to Self** (*Surrender*)
- 4. Growth (through reading)
- 5. Transformation (through renewing thoughts of imagination)
- 6. Walking with JESUS (more important than worship)
- 7. Pleasing & Knowing God (required for Salvation)







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You cannot enter the Kingdom of Heaven without <u>Repentance</u>

- <u>Repent</u> Greek word <u>metanoeō</u> which means to "think differently"
- **2.** John taught repentance (St. Matthew 3:1-2)
 - In those days came John the Baptist, preaching in the wilderness of Judaea,
 - 2. And saying, Repent ye: for the kingdom of heaven is at hand.







- 4. Jesus commanded repentance (St. Matt. 4:17)
 - 17. From that time Jesus began to preach, and to say, Repent: for the kingdom of heaven is at hand.
- 5. Peter taught repentance (Acts 2:37-38)
 - 37. Now when they heard this, they were <u>pricked</u> in their heart, and <u>said</u> unto Peter and to the rest of the apostles, Men and brethren, what shall we <u>do</u>?
 - 38. Then Peter said unto them, Repent, and be baptized every one of you in the name of Jesus Christ for the remission of sins, and ye shall receive the gift of the Holy Ghost.







- 6. Jesus commanded repentance to the Seven Churches of Asia (Rev 2:5, 16, 21-22)
 - (Ephesus) <u>Remember</u> therefore from whence thou art fallen, and <u>repent</u>, and do the first works; or else I will come unto thee quickly, and will remove thy candlestick out of his place, except thou repent.
 - 16. (Pergamos) Repent; or else I will come unto thee quickly, and will fight against them with the sword of my mouth.
 - 21. (Thyatira) And I gave her space to repent of her fornication; and she repented not.
 - 22. (Thyatira) Behold, I will cast her into a bed, and them that commit adultery with her into great tribulation, except they repent of their deeds.







- **6.** Jesus commanded repentance to the Seven Churches of Asia (*Rev* 3:3, 18-19)
 - 3. (Sardis) Remember therefore how thou hast received and heard, and hold fast, and repent. If therefore thou shalt not watch, I will come on thee as a thief, and thou shalt not know what hour I will come upon thee.
 - 18. (Laodiceans) 18 I counsel thee to buy of me gold tried in the fire, that thou mayest be rich; and white raiment, that thou mayest be clothed, and that the shame of thy nakedness do not appear; and anoint thine eyes with eyesalve, that thou mayest see.
 - 19. (Laodiceans) 19 As many as I love, I rebuke and chasten: be zealous therefore, and repent.

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Faith is first and is required to come to God

- **1.** Paul teaches that we must have faith in GOD first (*Heb. 11:6*)
 - 6. But without faith it is impossible to please him: for he that cometh to God must believe that he is, and that he is a rewarder of them that diligently seek him.
- **2.** Faith Required to be saved (*Rom. 10:9-10*)
 - 9. That if thou shalt confess with thy mouth the Lord Jesus, and shalt believe in thine heart that God hath raised him from the dead, thou shalt be saved.
 - 10. For with the heart man <u>believeth</u> unto righteousness; and with the mouth confession is made unto salvation.







- **3.** The Just shall Live by Faith (*Rom. 1:17; Gal 3:11; Heb 10:38-39*)
 - 17. (Romans) For therein is the righteousness of God revealed from faith to faith: as it is written, The just shall live by faith.
 - 11. (Galatians) But that no man is justified by the law in the sight of God, it is evident: for, The just shall live by faith.
 - 38. (Hebrews) Now the just shall live by faith: but if any man draw back, my soul shall have no pleasure in him.
 - *39. (Hebrews)* **But we are not of them who draw back unto perdition; but of them that** believe to the saving of the soul.

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2. Faith (Con't)



- 4. Faith without Work is Dead (Jam. 2:20-26)
 - 20. But wilt thou know, O vain man, that faith without works is dead?
 - 21. Was not Abraham our father justified by works, when he had offered Isaac his son upon the altar?
 - 22. Seest thou how faith wrought with his works, and by works was faith made perfect?
 - 23. And the scripture was fulfilled which saith, Abraham believed God, and it was imputed unto him for righteousness: and he was called the Friend of God.
 - 24. Ye see then how that by works a man is justified, and not by faith only.
 - 25. Likewise also was not Rahab the harlot justified by works, when she had received the messengers, and had sent them out another way?

26.For as the body without the spirit is dead, so faith without works is dead also.







True Disciple must die to themselves if they are to follow JESUS

- **1.** True Discipleship requires an individual to die to themselves (St. Matt. 16:24-26)
 - 24. Then said Jesus unto his disciples, If any man will <u>come after</u> me, let him <u>deny</u> himself, and <u>take up</u> his cross, and <u>follow</u> me.
 - 25. For whosoever <u>will save</u> his life <u>shall lose it</u>: and whosoever <u>will</u> <u>lose</u> his life for my <u>sake shall find</u> it.
 - 26. For what is a man profited, if he shall <u>gain the</u> whole world, and <u>lose</u> his own soul? or what shall a man <u>give</u> in exchange for his soul?







- **2. We need to become a living sacrifice to follow JESUS** *(Romans 12:1-2)*
 - I <u>beseech</u> you therefore, brethren, by the mercies of God, that ye <u>present</u> your <u>bodies</u> a <u>living sacrifice</u>, holy, acceptable unto God, which is your reasonable service.
 - 2. And be not conformed to this world: but be ye transformed by the renewing of your mind, that ye may prove what is that good, and acceptable, and perfect, will of God.







Peter commanded that we read GOD's WORD to GROW 2 Peter 2:1-2

- Wherefore laying aside all malice (wickedness), and all guile (deceit), and hypocrisies, and envies, and all evil speakings,
- As newborn babes, <u>desire</u> the <u>sincere milk</u> of the <u>WORD</u>, that ye may <u>GROW</u> thereby:





JESUS sent the Word to Wash and Cleanse His Bride, the Church (the Ekklessia) (Eph 5:25-32)

- 25. Husbands, love your wives, even as CHRIST also loved the church, and gave Himself for it;
- 26. That He might sanctify and cleanse it with the washing of water by the WORD,
- 27. That He might present it to Himself a glorious church, not having spot, or wrinkle, or any such thing; but that it should be holy and without blemish.
- 28. So ought men to love their wives as their own bodies. He that loveth his wife loveth himself.
- 29. For no man ever yet hated his own flesh; but nourisheth and cherisheth it, even as the Lord the church:
- 30. For we are members of his body, of his flesh, and of his bones.
- **31.** For this cause shall a man leave his father and mother, and shall be joined unto his wife, and they two shall be one flesh.

32. This is a great mystery: but I speak concerning Christ and the church.

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Those who do not <u>wash</u> in the WORD are "Dirty Babies" who will <u>GROW UP</u> to be "Filthy Brides" <u>unprepared</u> for the LORD's return!







- 2. We need to become transformed by the renewing of mind through the reading and studying of the Word of GOD (Romans 12:1-2)
 - 1. I <u>beseech</u> you therefore, brethren, by the mercies of God, that ye <u>present</u> your bodies a <u>living sacrifice</u>, holy, acceptable unto God, which is your reasonable service.
 - 2. And be not conformed to this world: but be ye transformed by the renewing of your mind, that ye may prove what is that good, and acceptable, and perfect, will of God.



6. Walking with JESUS



We were called to focus on WALKING; but many focus on WORSHIP

- **1.** Paul primary purpose for writing was to teach us how to <u>WALK</u> with JESUS (as JESUS called his followers to do during His earthly ministry) (1 Thess. 4:1-4)
 - 1. Furthermore then we <u>beseech</u> you, brethren, and <u>exhort</u> you by the Lord Jesus, that as ye have <u>received</u> of us how ye ought to <u>walk</u> and to <u>please</u> God, so ye would <u>abound</u> more and more.
 - 2. For ye know what commandments we gave you by the Lord Jesus.
 - 3. For this is the will of God, even your <u>sanctification</u>, that ye should <u>abstain</u> from <u>fornication</u>:
 - 4. That every one of you should know how to possess his vessel in <u>sanctification</u> and <u>honour</u>;







- **2.** Worship is Vain if we are defiled if we are filled with evil thoughts *(St. Matt. 15:7-9, 16-19)*
 - 7. Ye hypocrites, well did Esaias prophesy of you, saying,
 - 8. This <u>people draweth nigh unto me with their m</u>outh, and <u>honoureth me with</u> <u>their lips</u>; but their <u>heart</u> is far from me.
 - 9. But in vain they do worship me, <u>teaching</u> for doctrines the <u>commandments of</u> <u>men</u>.
 - 17. Do not ye yet understand, that whatsoever entereth in at the mouth goeth into the belly, and is cast out into the draught?
 - But those things which proceed out of the mouth come forth from the heart; and they defile the man.
 - 19. For out of the heart proceed evil thoughts, murders, adulteries, fornications, thefts, false witness, blasphemies:
 - 20. These are the things which defile a man: but to eat with unwashen hands defileth not a man.

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- **3.** Holy Spirit will not dwell in an unclean (defiled) temple of a person's body (1 Cor. 3:16-17)
 - 16. <u>Know</u> ye <u>not</u> that ye <u>are the temple</u> of God, and that the Spirit of God dwelleth <u>in</u> you?
 - 17. If any man <u>defile</u> the <u>temple</u> of God, him shall God <u>destroy</u>; for the <u>temple</u> of God is <u>holy</u>, which <u>temple</u> ye <u>are</u>.
 - 18. Let <u>no</u> man <u>deceive</u> himself. If any man <u>among you seemeth to be wis</u>e in this world, let him <u>become a fool</u>, that he <u>may be</u> wise.
 - 19. For the wisdom of this world is foolishness with God. For it is written, He taketh the wise in their own craftiness.,





4. Paul teaches that we are called to Walk and Love JESUS (Eph 5:1-5)

- **1.** Be ye therefore <u>followers</u> of God, as dear children;
- 2. And <u>walk</u> in love, as Christ also hath loved us, and hath given himself for us an offering and a sacrifice to God for a sweetsmelling savour.
- But <u>fornication</u>, and <u>all uncleanness</u>, or <u>covetousness</u>, let it <u>not</u> be once <u>named</u> among you, as becometh <u>saints</u>;
- 4. <u>Neither filthiness</u>, nor <u>foolish talking</u>, nor <u>jesting</u>, which are <u>not</u> <u>convenient</u>: but rather giving of thanks.
- For this ye know, that <u>no whoremonger</u>, nor <u>unclean person</u>, nor <u>covetous</u> man, who is an <u>idolater</u>, <u>hath any</u> inheritance in the <u>kingdom of</u> <u>Christ and of God</u>.

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- **5.** Paul teaches that we are called to Walk in the Spirit (Gal. 5:16-21)
 - 16. This I say then, <u>Walk</u> in the Spirit, and ye shall not fulfil the <u>lust of the</u> <u>flesh</u>.
 - 17. For the flesh <u>lusteth</u> against the Spirit, and the Spirit against the flesh; and these are <u>contrary</u> the one to the other: so that ye <u>cannot do</u> the things that ye would.
 - 18. But if ye be led of the Spirit, ye are not under the law.
 - 19. Now the works of the flesh are manifest, which are these; <u>Adultery</u>, <u>fornication</u>, <u>uncleanness</u>, <u>lasciviousness</u>,
 - 20. <u>Idolatry</u>, <u>witchcraft</u>, <u>hatred</u>, <u>variance</u>, <u>emulations</u>, <u>wrath</u>, <u>strife</u>, <u>seditions</u>, <u>heresies</u>,
 - 21. Envyings, murders, drunkenness, revellings, and such like: of the which I tell you before, as I have also told you in time past, that they which do such things shall not inherit the kingdom of God.

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Disciples are called to please and know GOD that JESUS might know them

- **1.** Paul reveals that Walking with JESUS is how we Please the Father (1 Thess. 4:1-2)
 - Furthermore then we beseech you, brethren, and exhort you by the Lord Jesus, that as ye <u>have received</u> of us <u>how ye ought</u> to <u>walk</u> and to <u>please</u> God, so ye would <u>abound</u> more and more.
 - 2. For ye <u>know</u> what commandments we <u>gave</u> you by the Lord Jesus.





2. Our Father knows us when we Love him (1 Cor. 8:1-3)

- 1. Now as touching things offered unto idols, we know that we all have knowledge. Knowledge puffeth up, but charity edifieth.
- 2. And if any man think that he knoweth any thing, he knoweth nothing yet as he ought to know.
- 3. But if any man love God, the same is known of him.
- **3. Enoch pleased GOD and was translated that he should not see death** (*Heb. 11:5*)
 - 5. By faith Enoch was translated that he should not see death; and was not found, because God had translated him: for before his translation he had this testimony, that he pleased God.



What Does God Want Summary



These seven (7) items provide a roadmap to discipleship

- **1. Repentance** (Think Differently)
- 2. Faith (God requires this first)
- **3.** Die to Self (Surrender)
- 4. Growth (through reading)
- 5. Transformation (through renewing thoughts of imagination)
- 6. Walking with JESUS (more important than worship)
- 7. Pleasing & Knowing God (required for Salvation)

(2 Peter 2:1-2) (1) Wherefore laying aside all <u>malice</u> (wickedness), and all <u>guile</u> (deceit), and <u>hypocrisies</u>, and <u>envies</u>, and all <u>evil speakings</u>, (2) As newborn babes, <u>desire</u> the <u>sincere milk</u> of the <u>WORD</u>, that ye may <u>GROW</u> <u>thereby</u>:

(1 Thess. 4:1-4) (1) Furthermore then we beseech you, brethren, and exhort you by the LORD JESUS, that as ye have <u>received of us how ye</u> <u>ought to walk</u> and to <u>please</u> GOD, so YE would <u>abound more</u> and <u>more</u>. (2) For ye know what <u>commandments</u> we <u>gave</u> you by the LORD JESUS. (3) For this is the <u>will of</u> GOD, even your <u>sanctification</u>, that ye should <u>abstain from fornication</u>: (4) That every one of you should know how to possess his vessel in <u>sanctification</u> and honour; (5) <u>not</u> in the lust of concupiscence, even as the Gentiles which <u>know not</u> GOD:







- 1. Disciples were called to FEED THEMSELVES by DESIRING the SINCERE MILK of GOD's WORD
- 2. Gentile Disciples were given the <u>Commandments by the Apostles</u> whom JESUS CHRIST had <u>CHOSEN</u> (like <u>Paul</u>, <u>Peter</u>, <u>James</u>, <u>John</u>, <u>etc</u>.) (Acts 1:1-2)
 - a) Were <u>NEVER</u> commanded to keep Moses Law or to keep the Holy Days (Col 2:16-21, Acts 15)
 - b) Early Gentile Disciples DID NOT HAVE the texts of the OT LAW (Torah and the prophets)
 - c) Early Gentile Disciples <u>READ</u> and <u>STUDIED</u> <u>LETTERS</u> (Epistles) written by the Apostles
 - a) The APOSTLES' LETTERS <u>CONTAINED</u> the <u>COMMANDMENTS</u> of the <u>NT Church</u> SENT by JESUS CHRIST through the HOLY GHOST
 - b) <u>COMMANDMENTS</u> could NOT be GIVEN, until AFTER the HOLY GHOST was SENT on <u>DAY of</u> <u>PENTCOST</u> (St. John 16:7-12; Acts 1:4-8, 2:1-21)

Acts 1:2 UNTIL the DAY in which HE (JESUS) was TAKEN UP, AFTER that HE THROUGH the HOLY GHOST had <u>GIVEN</u> COMMANDMENTS unto the APOSTLES WHOM HE HAD CHOSEN



Had to wait on the HOLY GHOST



JESUS did <u>not</u> send commandments <u>during</u> His earthly Ministry

St. John 16:7, 11-12

- Nevertheless I tell you the truth; It is expedient for you that I go away: for if I go not away, the <u>comforter will not come</u> unto you; but if I depart, I will send <u>Him</u> unto you.
- 12. I have yet many things to say unto you, but ye cannot bear them now.
- 13. Howbeit when <u>He</u>, the <u>SPIRIT</u> of <u>Truth</u>, is COME, <u>He will guide you into all truth</u>: for <u>He</u> shall <u>not</u> speak of <u>Himself</u>; but whatsoever <u>He</u> shall hear, that shall <u>he</u> speak: and <u>he will show you things to come</u>.
- <u>NT Commandments</u> could <u>not</u> be given until <u>AFTER</u> the HOLY GHOST came on the Day of Pentecost



Origins of the Modern Christian Church



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Establishment of Modern Church after JESUS died was difficult for following three (3) main reasons based on this article.

(Quoted from the University of Wyoming (UW) Religion Today: How Constantine Created the Christian **Church**, February 4, 2015)

- "First, travel and communication were difficult at that time" 1.
- "Second, there was little agreement about Christianity's beliefs and teachings, 2. the nature of Jesus and God, what writings were sacred, or even how to worship."
- 3. "Third, imperial persecutions of Christians happened every few decades."
 - "These drove Christianity underground and caused many Christians to turn away." a)
 - "But almost worse were the rifts that appeared afterward between Christians who kept the faith and those who APOSTATIZED to SAVE their LIVES, both of whom STILL CONSIDERED b) THEMSELVES CHRISTIANS."

Constantine I established the Modern Christian Church

- 1. "But if the founding of the church is defined as the first body of <u>CHRISTIAN</u> <u>LEADERS</u> who could <u>determine accurate Christian belief</u> and <u>establish with</u> <u>sound authority</u> their <u>DEFINITION of CHRISTIANITY</u> across the <u>Mediterranean world</u>, then the <u>SINGLE MAN MOST</u> responsible for that achievement was <u>Constantine I, the emperor of Rome</u>. "
- 2. "Although the CREATION and ORGANIZATION of the CHURCH was <u>clearly a</u> process that took place over several decades, the founding event was the Council of Nicea in 325 A.D."

Origins of the Modern Christian Church



Constantine I made Christianity a legal religion

- "Constantine appeared on the scene in the midst of the so-called Great Persecution, begun in 303 A.D., under Emperor Diocletian"
- 2. "By 305 A.D., the problems caused by the persecution were overtaken by those of determining Diocletian's successor"
- "More than <u>six different generals</u> would fight to become the emperor. Constantine stood out because he became a Christian and unabashedly made Jesus the patron of his army. By 313 A.D., just two contenders remained, Constantine and Licinius"
- 4. "The two jointly issued the Edict of Milan, which made CHRISTIANITY a LEGAL RELIGION and officially ended the persecution"
- 5. "But, it was not until 324 A.D. that Constantine finally became the sole ruler of the Roman Empire"

Saint Augustine, Philosophical Father of the Modern Christian Church



Augustine was Born: November 13, 354 A.D. / Died: August 28, 430 A.D.

- 1. He adapted CLASSICAL THOUGHT to CHRISTIAN TEACHING and created a POWERFUL THEOLOGICAL SYSTEM of LASTING INFLUENCE
- 2. He also <u>shaped the PRACTICE of BIBLICAL EXEGESIS</u> and helped lay the foundation for much of medieval and MODERN CHRISTIAN THOUGHT
- 3. In <u>Roman Catholicism</u> he is <u>formally recognized</u> as a <u>doctor of the church</u>
- 4. More than five million words of his writings survive
- 5. <u>Most INFLUENTIAL adaptation</u> of the ANCIENT PLATONIC TRADITION with CHRISTIAN IDEAS that EVER OCCURRED in the LATIN CHRISTIAN WORLD
- 6. His <u>particular</u> <u>SYNTHESIS</u> of <u>CHRISTIAN</u>, <u>ROMAN</u>, and <u>PLATONIC</u> TRADITIONS defined the <u>terms for much later</u> <u>TRADITION</u> and <u>DEBATE</u>.

Platonic Traditions



The term "Platonism" is so widely used in modern scholarship that it is difficult to determine its meaning precisely as applicable either to a particular group of thinkers or to a specific COLLECTION of DOCTRINES. Ancient sources frequently describe "PLATONISTS" as those PHILOSOPHERS who further developed the known or presumed teaching of PLATO HIMSELF and "ACADEMICS" as those who pursued the SKEPTICAL METHODOLOGY believed to have been INITIATED by the **SOCRATES of PLATO's EARLIER DIALOGUES**. However, the substantive "Platonism" seems first to occur in scholarly literature only around the beginning of the eighteenth century when it was used to characterize **DOCTRINES** that were **NOT ONLY DERRIVED** from but also **COMBINED WITH PLATO'S OWN TEACHINGS by later EXEGETES.**

1	GOD and JESUS are in Heaven. JESUS CHRIST is the head of His Body, the Church (Acts 7:55-56; Col. 1:18-20)	Pope is said to be direct successor of St Peter; Pope has Papal infallibility from CHRIST (GOD on the earth)
2	Baptism (immersed) in water / HOLY GHOST / BORN AGAIN into the Kingdom of GOD (St. Matt. 28:18-20; St. Mark 16:16; Acts 1:5)	Be Sprinkled at birth and later receive the Roman Catechism to become a member of the Catholic Church
3	Confess your sins to <u>GOD</u> in Heaven (1 John 1:5-10)	Confess your sins to the Priest

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- Living in the END DAYS since the outpouring of the HOLY GHOST on the Day of Pentecost
 - GOD poured out of His SPIRIT on all flesh in the LAST DAYS (Acts 2:16-21)
- FOCUSES on Disciples as the Church of JESUS CHRIST
 - Followers must become "STUDENTS" or "PUPILS" of the Holy Scriptures
 - Followers must seek to "BE LED BY THE HOLY SPIRIT"
 - Followers must understand that they "ARE the NT CHURCH and BRIDE of JESUS CHRIST"

LEARN TO SEEK THE TRUTH AND LISTEN TO THE HOLY SPIRIT!

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- Understand that individuals who <u>repent</u> and are <u>BORN AGAIN</u> of the <u>WATER</u> and the <u>SPIRIT</u> are the <u>Church</u>, the <u>living body of JESUS</u>, <u>His</u> <u>Disciples</u>
- 2. Understand that the <u>Holy Scriptures</u> <u>never looks or speaks to the</u> <u>Church</u> as a <u>religious organization</u> (NOTE: This can <u>distort one's</u> <u>understanding</u> of what it means to be <u>a Disciple</u> and <u>Follower of JESUS</u> <u>CHRIST</u>)
 - 1. The Organized Modern Christian Church was brought into existence by the Roman Government
 - 2. It is based on the philosophical thoughts of the ancient world and it mixes those with Christian views and the Roman Culture
- 3. Understand that <u>WE</u> are to FOCUS on <u>being BORN AGAIN</u>, <u>being led by</u> the Holy SPIRIT, and were called to be STUDENTS of the Holy Scriptures


