Scriptural Highlight Colors & Meanings



- Purple (Royal) Royal Heavenly Nouns (Names of God, Jesus, Holy Ghost, Heaven, etc.)
- Blue (Royal, Dark) <u>Spiritual Truths & Commandments</u> (Covenant, Faith, Hope, Love, Repent, Sanctify, Walk, Thoughts, Imaginations, Heart, etc.)
- Orange Action Verbs (What Disciples are commanded to do or allow to be done in their lives i.e., hear, purge, confirm, continue, speak, build, partake, rejoice, give, etc.)
- Red Forbidden Thoughts or Actions (thoughts, sins, transgression, actions, behaviors that disciples should not permit in their thought life or their behaviors)
- Green <u>Earthly Nouns</u> (Names of disciples, saints, apostles, places, etc.)
- Pink Conditional Statement (A choice that results in a consequence, i.e., If/Then statements: "IF you continue in my words, THEN are ye my Disciples indeed.") (St. John 8:31)
- Yellow Highlighted (done for emphasis on select words like any, all, every, etc.)
- Blue (Light) <u>Adjectives</u> (words that modify/clarify spiritual commandments & truths)

Discipleship Lost



Characteristics of early NT Disciples

- A life to be lived as a disciple of Christ
- Worship God and Jesus
- Meets in homes and live their lives (their bodies) as the NT Temples
- Living "Church" and Bride of Christ
- Demonstrated miracles & powers
- Lay down their lives by beasts, crucifixions, burnings, etc.
- To live is Christ

Characteristics of Today's Christians

- A religion to be followed, led by men
- Idolizes men and organizations
- Meets in buildings modeled after the OT Temple (Tabernacle)
- Goes to "Church" as activity
- Mostly void of miracles and power
- Lives to gratify the flesh and fulfil their lusts
- Live for themselves



Discipleship Lost



- 1. What happened? Why are most not willing to lay down their life?
- 2. Why do most who profess Christ:
 - a. Never focus on repenting (changing the way they are thinking)?
 - b. Never invest in reading and studying the Holy Scriptures?
 - c. Are content to follow man despite the Lord's warnings of false teachers?
 - d. Believe in doctrines and dogma that are not clearly stated in Scriptures?
 - e. **Do not** focus on becoming "**Doers of the Word**"?
 - f. Do not focus on the renewing of their mind?
 - g. Do not focus on transforming the thoughts of their mind?
 - h. Do not walk with Jesus or focus on pleasing our Father in Heaven?
 - i. <u>Do not</u> focus on <u>preparing for Jesus' return</u>?







Greek Definitions to Key Discipleship Words





- It is critical that Disciples know and use the original definitions of the words that God gave to the Apostle writers of the NT Scriptures
 - The Word of God is eternal and never changes (Psa. 119:89, 160; 1 Pet. 1:25; St. Mat. 24:35; St. Mark 13:31; St. Luke 21:33; 2 Tim. 3:16-17)
 - Scriptures are not open to private interpretations of individuals (2 Pet. 1:20-21)
 - Many translations have perverted the true meanings of the Words given by the Holy Ghost through the Apostles
 - The Greek language was chosen by God for the NT Writings
 - Greek language is one of the most expressive if not the most expressive languages in the world next to Hebrew
 - Many religious leaders have <u>exclude key discipleship words from their teachings</u>
 - Having the true definitions from the original language will enable disciples to truly understand and follow God's NT Commandments so they can walk upright and please Him

James (#1)



Historical Overview

- Date Written: 50 AD
- Author: James, the Brother of JESUS (Met Paul when he went to Jerusalem, Gal. 1:19)
- BOOK #: 1st of 1
- Key Note: First NT Book written
- Main Theme "Practical Discipleship, manifesting itself in good works, contracted with mere
 Profession of Faith" (Thompson Chain Bible, 4281)

Major Discipleship Teachings

Sets the Foundation for Discipleship by describing the truths of the Kingdom of Heaven that are to govern a disciple's life!

- Trials of life are meant to perfect you (1:2-1-4)
- 2. Ask GOD if you lack Wisdom (1:5-8)
- 3. Endure temptations to receive the crown of life (1:12-18)
- 4. Be swift to hear, slow to speak, slow to wrath (1:19-20)
- 5. The <u>WORD</u> is able to save your soul (1:21)
- 6. You must be doer of WORD, not a hearer only (1:22-27)
- 7. Faith without works is dead (2:14-26)
- 8. You must tame your tongue (3:1-12)
- 9. Warning against worldliness (4:1 4:12)
- 10. Warning to the Rich, patience in suffering, Prayer of Faith (5)



1 Thessalonians (#2)



Historical Overview

- Date Written: 52-53 AD
- Author: Paul, the Apostle
- BOOK #: 1st of 14
- Key Note: Paul's First NT Book written
- Main Theme "Explains the purpose of Paul's writings. The future coming of Christ. Exhortation to purity by disciples. Commands the letters to be read by all the holy brethren." (Thompson Chain Bible, 4274)

Major Discipleship Teachings

Sets the foundation for discipleship in that the writings of Paul is to teach disciples "How-To" Walk and Please God!

- 1. Paul writes that disciples will know how to walk and to please God (4:1-7)
- 2. Paul commands epistles be read unto all the holy brethren (5:17)
- 3. Thessalonians are examples of faithful disciples (1:2-10)
- 4. Paul's example of faithful ministry (2:1-16)
- 5. The coming of the Lord (4:13-18)
- 6. The day of the Lord and how to be prepared (5:1-11)
- 7. Know them which labor among you and who are over you (5:12-13)
- 8. Patterns of discipleship behavior (5:14-28)



2 Thessalonians (#3)

- Key Note: Paul's First NT Book written
- Main Theme "The second coming of Christ. The falling away from the faith. Warnings against living in sin." (Thompson Chain Bible, 4275)

Major Discipleship Teachings

Warns about Jesus' coming and the Lord's judgment

- 1. The judgment at Christ's coming (1:5-12)
- 2. Great falling away and the man of lawlessness (2:1-12)
- 3. Call to stand firm in Jesus Christ (2:13-17)
- 4. Warning against idleness (3:6-15)



Galatians (#4)



Historical Overview

- Date Written: 54 AD
- Author: Paul, the Apostle
- BOOK #: 3rd of 14
- Key Note: Paul's First NT Book written
- Main Theme "Paul certifies his writings are directly from Jesus Christ. Doctrine of Justification by Faith. Warning against reversion to Judaism." (Thompson Chain Bible, 4270)

Major Discipleship Teachings

Paul certifies his Gospel is direct from Jesus Christ and explains the OT Law was our school master to bring us to Christ

- 1. Paul certifies his gospel is direct from Jesus Christ (1:6-24)
- 2. Gospel of the circumcision and the uncircumcision (2:1-10)
- 3. Justification by faith, Live by Faith (2:15-21) (3:10-14)

Major Discipleship Teachings

Set one's affections on things above and not on things on the earth; beware of philosophy and traditions that turn from Christ!

- 1. Commands disciples to read epistles (4:16)
- 2. Thanksgiving and prayer to pray (1:3-1:14)
- 3. The fullness of the Godhead dwells in Christ (1:19, 2:9)
- 4. Be <u>not moved awa</u>y from the hope of the Gospel (1:23)
- 5. Walk in Christ, stablished in the faith (2:6-2:7)
- 6. Beware if philosophy, vain deceit, traditions of men (2:8)
- 7. Buried with Christ by baptism (2:12)
- B. Law nailed to cross; freed-meat, drink, sabbath, etc. (2:16)

Have love and faith for Jesus and all the saints!

- Have love and faith for Jesus and all saints (1:5)
- 2. Praying that others might forgive and restore those who have repented (1:10-1:17)



Ephesians (#11)

- BOOK #: 10th of 10
- Key Note: First NT Book written
- Main Theme "Emphasizes
 the church as the bride of
 Jesus Christ. Paul reveals his
 knowledge of mysteries.
 Unity of the church. Walk in
 newness of life with JESUS
 Christ." (Thompson Chain Bible, 4271)

Major Discipleship Teachings

Walk in newness of life; Living in the works of flesh like fornication and uncleanness will not inherit heaven and be married to Christ!

BOOK #: 1st of 2

- Key Note: The first Gospel of Jesus that was written
- Main Theme "Gives a connected and orderly narrative of the life of Christ as seen by eye witnesses." The Gospel of "The Son of Man." (Thompson Chain Bible, 4264)

Major Discipleship Teachings

Provide a comprehensive historical account of the life of Jesus Christ

- 1. Provides eyewitnesses account of Jesus life story (1:1-1:4)
- 2. The most detailed accounts of the birth of John the Baptist and of Jesus Christ (1:5-3:22)
- 3. The <u>Complete Genealogy of Jesus Christ</u>, from Adam to Joseph (3:23-38)
- 4. Jesus's ministry and healings (4:1-21-38)
- 5. Jesus trail, crucifixion, and resurrection (22:1-24:53)



Acts of the Apostles (#13)



Historical Overview

- Date Written: 64 AD
- Author: Luke, the Physician
- BOOK #: 2nd of 2
- Key Note: Eyewitness account of early church history. 2/3 of history devoted to Paul
- Main Theme "The history of the development of the early church, from the Ascension of Christ" (Thompson Chain Bible, 4266)

Major Discipleship Teachings

Provides a picture of what true discipleship in "Looks like." Provides the best examples of "How-To" walk as a true disciple!

- 1. Jesus did <u>not</u> send <u>commandments</u> for <u>the New Covenant</u> <u>until</u> after the Holy Ghost (by His Apostles) (1:1-1:2)
- 2. Holy Ghost filled disciples on Day of Pentecost (2:1-2:41)
- 3. Disciples were the Church; fellowship (2:42-47)
- 4. Ministry and persecution of NT Church in Jerusalem (3:1-6:15)
- 5. Stephen is martyred, led by Paul, disciples scatter (8)
- 5. Paul personally called by Jesus on road to Damascus (9)
- 7. Peter sent to Gentiles (Cornelius) (10-11)

- Main Theme "Counsel to ministers for conduct and behavior. Qualifications of bishops and deacons.
 Warning against future apostasy." (Thompson Chain Bible, 4276)

Major Discipleship Teachings

Great foundational book of truths of discipleship

- 1. Warning against **false** teachers (1:3-1:11)
- 2. Jesus came to save sinners (1:12-20)
- 3. **Pray for authority** and all people (2:1-2:7)
- 4. Qualification for bishops & deacons (3:1-3:13)
- 5. The mystery of Godliness (3:14-3:16)
- 6. Some shall depart from the faith in the last days (4:1-4:5)
- 7. Give attendance to reading, exhortation and doctrine (4:13)

- 2. Unto the pure, all things are pure (1:15)
- Some profess they know God, but in works they deny Him, being abominable, disobedient, reprobate (1:16)
- 4. Teach sound doctrine (2:1-2:15)
- 5. Obey authority (3:1)
- 6. Speak evil of <u>no</u> man (3:2)
- 7. Be careful to maintain good works (3:3-3:8)

Establishment of Modern Church after JESUS died was difficult for following three (3) main reasons based on this article.

(Quoted from the University of Wyoming (UW) Religion Today: How Constantine Created the Christian Church, February 4, 2015)

- 1. "First, travel and communication were difficult at that time"
- 2. "Second, there was little agreement about Christianity's beliefs and teachings, the nature of Jesus and God, what writings were sacred, or even how to worship."
- 3. "Third, imperial persecutions of Christians happened every few decades."
 - a) "These drove Christianity underground and caused many Christians to turn away."
 - b) "But almost worse were the rifts that appeared afterward between Christians who kept the faith and those who APOSTATIZED to SAVE their LIVES, both of whom STILL CONSIDERED THEMSELVES CHRISTIANS."

Constantine I established the Modern Christian Church

- 1. "But if the founding of the church is defined as the first body of CHRISTIAN
 LEADERS who could determine accurate Christian belief and establish with sound authority their DEFINITION of CHRISTIANITY across the Mediterranean world, then the SINGLE MAN MOST responsible for that achievement was Constantine I, the emperor of Rome. "
- 2. "Although the CREATION and ORGANIZATION of the CHURCH was clearly a process that took place over several decades, the founding event was the Council of Nicea in 325 A.D."

Constantine I made Christianity a legal religion

- 1. "Constantine appeared on the scene in the midst of the so-called Great Persecution, begun in 303 A.D., under Emperor Diocletian"
- 2. "By 305 A.D., the problems caused by the persecution were overtaken by those of determining Diocletian's successor"
- 3. "More than six different generals would fight to become the emperor.

 Constantine stood out because he became a Christian and unabashedly made Jesus the patron of his army. By 313 A.D., just two contenders remained, Constantine and Licinius"
- 4. "The two jointly issued the Edict of Milan, which made CHRISTIANITY a LEGAL RELIGION and officially ended the persecution"
- 5. "But, it was not until 324 A.D. that Constantine finally became the sole ruler of the Roman Empire"

Saint Augustine, Philosophical Father of the Modern Christian Church



Augustine was Born: November 13, 354 A.D. / Died: August 28, 430 A.D.

- 1. He adapted CLASSICAL THOUGHT to CHRISTIAN TEACHING and created a POWERFUL THEOLOGICAL SYSTEM of LASTING INFLUENCE
- 2. He also shaped the PRACTICE of BIBLICAL EXEGESIS and helped lay the foundation for much of medieval and MODERN CHRISTIAN THOUGHT
- 3. In Roman Catholicism he is formally recognized as a doctor of the church
- 4. More than five million words of his writings survive
- 5. Most INFLUENTIAL adaptation of the ANCIENT PLATONIC TRADITION with CHRISTIAN IDEAS that EVER OCCURRED in the LATIN CHRISTIAN WORLD
- 6. His particular SYNTHESIS of CHRISTIAN, ROMAN, and PLATONIC TRADITIONS defined the terms for much later TRADITION and DEBATE.

Platonic Traditions



The term "Platonism" is so widely used in modern scholarship that it is difficult to determine its meaning precisely as applicable either to a particular group of thinkers or to a specific COLLECTION of DOCTRINES. Ancient sources frequently describe "PLATONISTS" as those PHILOSOPHERS who further developed the known or presumed teaching of PLATO HIMSELF and "ACADEMICS" as those who pursued the SKEPTICAL METHODOLOGY believed to have been INITIATED by the **SOCRATES of PLATO's EARLIER DIALOGUES**. However, the substantive "Platonism" seems first to occur in scholarly literature only around the beginning of the eighteenth century when it was used to characterize **DOCTRINES** that were **NOT ONLY DERRIVED** from but also **COMBINED WITH PLATO'S OWN TEACHINGS by later EXEGETES.**

Christianity Forbade Laity to Read



- 1. <u>Decree of the Council of Toulouse (1229 C.E.)</u>: "We <u>prohibit</u> also that the laity should be permitted to have the books of the Old or New Testament; but we <u>most strictly forbid</u> their <u>having any translation</u> of these books."
- 2. Ruling of the Council of Tarragona of 1234 C.E: "No one may possess the books of the Old and New Testaments in the Romance language, and if anyone possesses them he must turn them over to the local bishop within eight days after promulgation of this decree, so that they may be burned..."



Christianity Forbade Laity to Read



- 3. Proclamations at the Ecumenical Council of Constance in 1415 C.E.: Oxford professor, and theologian John Wycliffe, was the first (1380 C.E.) to translate the New Testament into English to "...helpeth Christian men to study the Gospel in that tongue in which they know best Christ's sentence." For this "heresy" Wycliffe was posthumously condemned by Arundel, the archbishop of Canterbury. By the Council's decree "Wycliffe's bones were exhumed and publicly burned and the ashes were thrown into the Swift River."
- 4. Fate of William Tyndale in 1536 C.E.: William Tyndale was burned at the stake for translating the Bible into English. According to Tyndale, the Church forbid owning or reading the Bible to control and restrict the teachings and to enhance their own power and importance.

3	Confess your sins to GOD in Heaven (1 John 1:5-10)	Confess your sins to the Priest
4	Disciple's <u>Father</u> is in Heaven. Call no man Father on the earth (St. Matt. 6:9, 23:9)	Call the leaders of the Catholic Church Fathers
5	Disciple's body is the temple (1 Cor. 3:16-17)	Rebuilt the Temple and called them cathedrals
6	Disciples are a Royal Priesthood (1 Peter 2:5, 9)	Only the catholic church can ordain a priest
7	Disciples are saints (sanctified, set apart) (1 Cor. 1:2)	Catholic Church is the only organization that can canonize individuals as saints
8	Pray to the Father in <u>JESUS'</u> Name (St. John 14:13-14, 15:16, 16:23-26)	Pray to Mary and the other Saints




